I am pleased to share with you the 25th Annual Report of Gregorian Public School. Human Resources

We started the year with 1782 students and a dedicated team of 92 teaching faculty who sets a strong academic back up for students. In addition to this we have 9 part time teachers who impart coaching in specialized skills like yoga, chess, dance (classical and western), percussion stringed instruments, skating, swimming etc. 85 members of the non-teaching section set the school work like a clock.
